We applied for some digital tablets from Royal Mencap and were allocated 20 tablets and associated 'techy bits'. In addition we were given £2k for training, so that the tablets can be used by our members. We have welcomed Karmel who has set up the tablets ready for them to be used. She is now training our members and has so far worked with 10 members, sometimes for several sessions. All these training sessions have been delivered through the Side-by-Side Club on Wednesday evenings.

Great news – our Dig-it project is growing! We now regularly have several of our members going every week. Huge thanks to Steve, Wendy and Jacquie.

I would like to welcome two new Side by Side volunteers, Jenny and Dave Cadge. As always we need to thank all our volunteers, staff and Trustees for helping Saffron Walden Mencap Society to continue to run all our many activities and events.

Dig-It Project – May 2022 – Jacquie Lucas

Almost a year has passed since I first visited the fantastic 'Dig It' Community allotments at Crocus Fields on June 18 th last year. At the time the plot itself needed a little TLC and I'm very proud to say that the area has been transformed, and our Mencap Community has played a large part in its recovery from a little lockdown neglect.

The club runs every Wednesday morning 10am – 1pm. We currently have three weekly volunteers, Steve and Wendy Lee and myself. We now have 7 regular gardeners, 6 of whom come on the ARC/HUB minibus with at least one staff member, only two are not Saffron Walden Mencap members and both of them are 'thinking about' joining! We employ a Dig-It horticulturalist, Bollette, who always keeps us all busy with various tasks leading up to lunch and a drink. After lunch we continue with jobs, clear up and harvest. The plot has really good produce, much of it planted from seed by the group, at present it goes back to the Hub as they have a 'shop and cook' club on a Thursday, and one member who likes to stir-fry takes some home most weeks.

While musing on the possibility of an 'allotment club' for our members I hoped that it would bring knowledge, self-esteem, friendship, good home grown produce and lots of fresh air for our participants. Dig-It has surpassed those aims, it has been wonderful to see members work independently and as a team, to see the pride when we look around every week at how things are progressing and watch friendships develop as we settle into a routine.

Huge thanks to Steve and Wendy Lee, and our most consistent member Amanda Lee. We are hoping to be a year round club with the installation of a new summerhouse, where we can keep warm and dry for cold or rainy day activities.

So a massive thank you goes out to Penny and Osman Al-Ibraham and Wendy Lee for all their work in keeping the club going.

We have recently been joined at the club by 3 new volunteers, namely husband and wife Dave and Jenny Cadge and Karmel Stannard. Karmel was employed on a temporary basis with us to teach or members how to set up and use the free tablets that our members can have if they would like one. Karmel has been showing members how to use them at the club and has found a love for the club and has therefore requested to stay on as a club volunteer. We welcome all three of them on board.

The club celebrates its 7th birthday this in May and we celebrated with members on 1st June with a joint Queen's platinum jubilee street party outside the Salvation Army Hall. A great time was had by all and lots of jellies and birthday cake were eaten.

Members are looking forward to a less restrictive summer this year with a couple of canal boat trip and visit to Finchingfield lavender farm.
